Practicing Family Medicine in Yellowknife

Yellowknife is currently recruiting for a **permanent Family Physician with Enhanced skills in Anesthesia**. Yellowknife serves as the referral centre for the Northwest Territories (NWT), as well as the Nunavut Kitikmeot region. This unique practice area gives our family practitioners a total catchment area of 50,000 covering close to 15% of Canada's geographic land area!

Within our small urban centre you have access to shopping, art, music and cultural festivals, recreational facilities, team sports, restaurants and so much more. Our airport operates daily flights to keep us connected to the rest of Canada and we have year-round road access to Alberta. Yellowknife and its residents are welcoming to newcomers and you will soon see why so many physicians call Yellowknife home.

Your anesthesia skills will be challenged in a collegial and supportive environment that offers a wide breadth of practice. You'll provide care for both adult and pediatric elective OR cases across general surgery, orthopedics, ENT, obstetrics and gynecology, ophthalmology, and urology. The role also includes providing sedation for our high-caliber endoscopy program and consultation for sedation in other higher-risk outpatient procedures. You'll deliver general anesthetic for pediatric dental cases and participate in on-call service coverage for the operating room, emergency department, and labour and delivery, including epidural administration. You will be working in collaborative multidisciplinary teams. Non-surgical local resources include respiratory therapy, Internal Medicine/Critical Care, Pediatrics, Radiology, and approximately 2 weeks per month OR coverage from FRCP Anesthesia.



Family practice clinical work will be included in your practice, and can involve a number of different opportunities including emergency medicine, primary care practice, and travel clinics to one of the communities surrounding Yellowknife to serve the small and predominantly Indigenous cultures of Dene, Inuit, and Metis. The NWT is leading the country in cultural competency and cultural safety training for our practitioners for better patient care. Yellowknife is a University of Alberta family medicine residency training site, allowing our practitioners to help train the next generation of family physicians.

Located above the 60th parallel, the Northwest Territories awaits with seemingly endless lakes and unmatched vistas. Home to approximately 43,000 people in 33 communities, the Northwest Territories is over 1.34 million square kilometers in size.

On the shores of Great Slave Lake lies the capital city of Yellowknife (population 21,000). The 'urban' centre of the territory, Yellowknife boasts all the amenities of a big city, while maintaining its small town charm, with outdoor wilderness adventures just minutes away.

With easy access to nature and long summer days, our physicians and their families take full advantage of the overnight, weekend, and week-long paddling, sailing, and camping opportunities available to them. Music and festival lovers can enjoy the always

and Ride Festival, and the weekly Farmer's Market at City Hall throughout the summer. Fishing enthusiasts will never be short of new lakes to explore, golfers can tee-off under the midnight sun, and white-water paddling lovers can spend a glorious August weekend at the Slave River Paddlefest in Fort Smith to enjoy our world-class rapids.

Yellowknife winters welcome the stunning northern lights, along with a whole new host of family-friendly activities and adventures. This includes exploring endless frozen lakes and trails for skiing, snowshoeing, snowmobiling, and even biking, as part of our every-growing fat bike community. In March, the doors to the world-famous Snow Castle on Great Slave Lake open to the public, with the Long-John Jamboree taking place just outside the castle walls.



Need a break from the outdoors? Northerners are renowned for their innovative spirit, especially during the cold winter months, so there's never a shortage of things to do. Indoor activities include including dance, arts, choir, and theatre community organizations, the Yellowknife International Film Festival, and local and international theatre and music performances at the Northern Arts and Cultural Centre.

Year round, Yellowknife is host to dozens of delicious dining opportunities ranging from Thai, to Korean, to Japanese, to Ethiopian. Beer aficionados can try our locally brewed beers at the Woodyard in Old Town. Yellowknife has an indoor running track, three ice-rinks, an incredible new aquatic centre (2025) with a 25-metre swimming pool and water slides, a climbing wall, a curling rink, and two indoor fields. There are also a variety of gyms, yoga, and boxing classes. For the team sports enthusiast, you can easily fill your days playing in any number of leagues including slo-pitch, soccer, pickle ball, Ultimate, volleyball, hockey, basketball... just to name a few. And the individual and team sports options available for youth are even more extensive!
