Practicing Family Medicine in Inuvik

Inuvik is currently recruiting for a **permanent Family Physician with skills in Low Risk Obstetrics**. Our Town of Inuvik offers rural and remote medicine at its finest, with incredible support staff in a unique Northern environment. Not only does the environment make it an unparalleled place to live and work... but the people will make it an amazing experience for you, and friends or family who may be considering the move with you.

The Inuvik Regional Hospital is the northernmost hospital with an OR on the continent. It is a 48-bed facility, including long-term care. The 14-bed acute care unit includes 2 labour and delivery rooms. Family Physicians reside in Inuvik and are part of a primary community care team, providing services in seven or more community health centers through scheduled travel, telephone, and Telehealth consultation.

Our local obstetrical physicians are well-supported: physicians with enhanced surgical skills and anesthetics are available for cesarean sections, epidurals, and critical cases; obstetricians in Yellowknife are just a phone call away. Our collegiality and backup on-call are legendary! We are a MORE OB certified hospital with Baby Friendly certification. Your practice will also include clinic, rural emergency medicine, inpatient care, and travel clinics. We host a variety of visiting specialists from Yellowknife and Edmonton, including Obstetrics and Gynecology, Orthopedic Surgery, General Surgery, ENT, Internal Medicine, Pediatrics, Psychiatry, and others.



We are an active teaching hospital with strong partnerships with multiple universities and programs across the country. There are generally 2 to 3 Family Medicine residents and 1 medical student at any given time throughout the academic year. Our site has been described as a "Gold standard" for such training by UBC Faculty.

If you are ready for adventure and a great sense of community, the Town of Inuvik and your colleagues at the Inuvik Regional Hospital are ready to welcome you. You will not meet a better, more collegial group of physicians to work with in all of Canada than right here, above the Arctic Circle, in the heart of the Mackenzie River Delta.

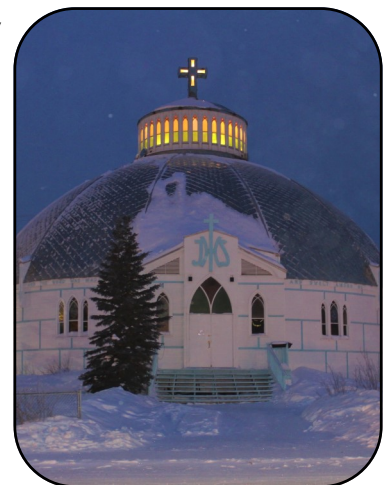

The Northwest Territories (NWT) is home to approximately 43,000 people in 33 communities across a landscape of over 1.34 million square kilometers.

Located just above the 68th parallel lies Canada's most northern region, the Beaufort Delta, with a population of 7,100 across eight communities. Inuvik is the third largest community in the NWT. Our region is full of northern culture, beauty, adventure, and Pingos!

The region is known for the talented artists that bring traditional crafts to modern-day life. Impressive beading, carving, fur crafts, and traditional clothing is for sale year-round online, at the seasonal Arctic Markets, and during the Great Northern Arts Festival.

You will find a new appreciation for snowshoeing, dogsledding, fishing, paddling, berry picking, and boating on the Mackenzie in this vast and charming region. Inuvik residents love baseball and hockey and host multiple tournaments annually. The recreation centre takes care of your other sporting needs with the aquatic centre, hockey arena, gym, as well as squash, curling, and a variety of sports.

Inuvik is a friendly town that is home to a diverse group of people including Inuvialuit, Gwich'in, and other indigenous people, as well as Northerners and Southerners from all over the world! There is also a large 2SLGBTQIA+ community. Inuvik is dynamic and welcoming to all!



Fun Facts About Inuvik

- Inuvik is home to the world's most northern full-service hospital.
- In the Arctic Circle, Inuvik experiences Polar night (nearly 30 days of dark), and Midnight sun (24 hours of sun) seasonally.
- The Sunrise festival is a 3-day party with fireworks, ice sculptures, artisan markets to welcome back the sun!
- The Igloo Church is the most popular tourist attraction in Inuvik.
- Inuvik is also home to the world's northernmost mosque – Midnight Sun Mosque.
- Visit Tuktoyaktuk to see the Arctic Ocean, the arctic tundra, and visit the ancient Pingos!
- From Inuvik, head to the once-in-a-lifetime unspoiled Ivvavik National Park to ride the rapids, hike the rolling mountains, spot Arctic wildlife, and fish for Arctic Char.
- The Dempster highway, Canada's only all-weather highway across the Arctic, connects Dawson City, Yukon to Tuktoyaktuk on the Arctic Ocean.
