Employee Profile:**Jordan Bassett, Quality Improvement Coordinator**

Jordan began her career with the Hay River Health and Social Services Authority in 2006, stepping into the medical clinic at just 20 years old. Her journey continued as an Admin in Public Health for six years, followed by a role as the territorial Electronic Medical Record (EMR) Administrator for another six years. In late 2018, Jordan transitioned to her current role as the Quality Improvement Coordinator.

A lifelong resident of the Northwest Territories, Jordan has spent most of her time in Hay River, with a few years in Pine Point. She is a busy mom of four—three daughters and one son, ranging in age from 5 to 21. With her children actively involved in hockey, figure skating, and other extracurricular activities. Jordan humorously remarks that she might as well set up camp at the arena. When she's not cheering them on, Jordan and her family enjoy baking, cooking, camping, fishing, quadding, and dirt biking.

Jordan's role as an EMR Administrator ignited her passion for education, as she found herself navigating complex interactions with vendors and IT professionals.

"It took me a full year to find the right program. With three kids at home, I couldn't attend in-person classes, and finding an accredited online program took some time."

Jordan eventually discovered an entirely online program from Nova Scotia's Center of Distance Education, which included annual practicums. During her second practicum, Jordan authored a paper titled *"ePrescribing: An Important Part of Medication,"* leading to an invitation to present at the Global Telemedicine and eHealth Conference in Luxembourg.

"It was fascinating to see how different our worlds are! There were people from all over, and it's important for northerners to share their unique perspectives. If you have something to write about, do it—the only thing they can say is no."

Earning her Certified Health Information Management (CHIM) Designation further deepened Jordan's

understanding of health information management, emphasizing patient safety, privacy, and confidentiality.

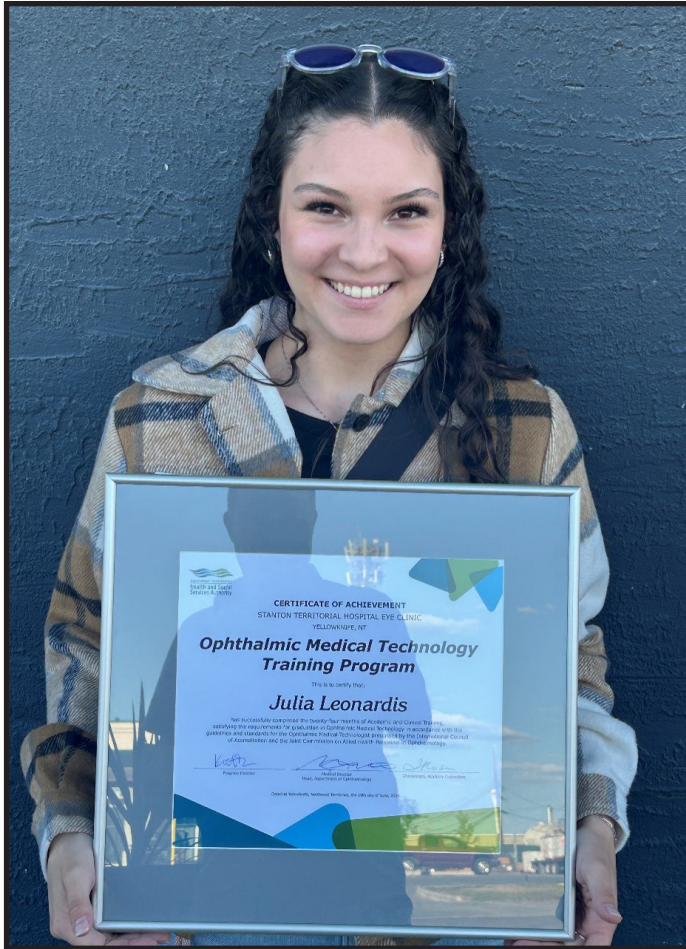

Employee Profile and Program Highlight:**Julia Leonardis, Ophthalmic Medical Technologist Training Program**

Congratulations to Julia Leonardis on her graduation from the Ophthalmic Medical Technologist Training Program (OMTTP) earlier this summer! Julia worked extremely hard over the two-year program to attain her graduate certificate and will be joining the clinic for a six-month term.

The OMTTP is a full-time, two-year program that trains students in the NWT to become certified Ophthalmic Medical Technologists. Based at the NTHSSA - Stanton Territorial Hospital Ophthalmology Clinic in Yellowknife, the program is recognized across Canada as one of the leading programs in this field. The majority of training takes place in Yellowknife in a classroom and clinic setting, and in travel clinics throughout the Northwest Territories and Nunavut. Recruitment for the program typically occurs every two years and the OMTTP is the primary source for technicians for the NTHSSA.

Tentative intake for the 2025-27 Training Program will commence in early 2025 for a September 2025 start.

Events**Łiwegòatì Building Opening!**

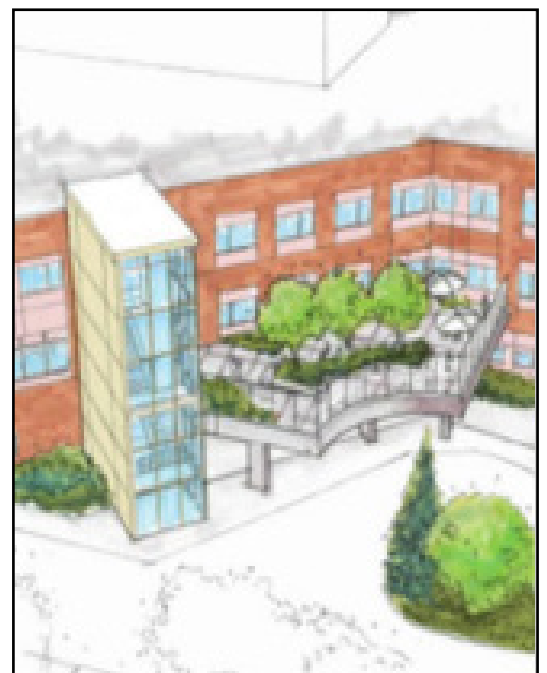
The Łiwegòatì facility opened for its first patient on May 30th, 2024!
